• Red Oak Health:

 Extension Horticulture Educator Ryan Pankau has finalized plans to apply mycorrhizae and Cambistat around the Red Oak and is working with F&S. These will be applied in the next few weeks and will be followed by a guest blog to explain the importance of these practices.

• Bridge Update:

 RORG Director Eliana Brown and volunteer Shannon Tucker report that we're on track to build the boardwalk bridge late-May/early-June. Micah Putman of Allerton Park has delivered Black Locust trees to The Woodshop, a local lumber mill, where they're being cut into lumber.

o **CoCoRaHS** rain gauge watchers reported 4.01 inches of precipitation.

Observations of note:

 March interest: Spring ephemerals installed last year, including hundreds of Virginia Bluebells, Shooting Star, Wild Hyacinth, and tulips, have emerged and will begin to bloom over the next few weeks. Sedges have begun to flower and green up.
